## Nurture Principle of the Week

We all learn in different ways

As you know we are focusing on 'Nurture' this term and how we can become more of a 'nurturing school', as we strongly believe it is important to ensure children are in a calm, supportive environment that helps them to learn.

Last week we launched the '**Six Principles of Nurture**' with the children with a whole school assembly and started with principle 1:

*We all learn in different ways*

Children learnt that we all learnt differently and need different things in different subjects to help us succeed. They all tried making something using origami by just looking at the picture and most children found this very hard. Then they were given verbal instructions or instructions with a video and images and found this much easier.

If you would like to support at home, here are some fun activities you could try:

### Some suggested activities for you to help at home:

- Talk to a member of your household about your favourite thing to learn/favourite subject – describe why you enjoy this.
- Try to teach a family member the origami you learnt at school. How will you help them learn? Will you draw a diagram, do a demonstration show them a video or something else?
- Draw a picture or take a photo of you in your house or outside learning something new.
- Write a senses poem about your senses when you are learning: **I see... I hear... I feel... I taste... I smell...**



- Create a poster about all things you like to learn and the ways you like to learn (eg. Listening to someone teach, writing notes to help you remember, role playing, reading, watching something, talking to someone, having a go yourself etc)
- Write an email/message/letter to your teacher explaining your favourite thing you have learnt since being at home. Describe what you have learnt and how you learnt it.
- Tell you family all about something you have learnt this week at school. It could be science, History, Geography or even the school rules – how much can you remember?
